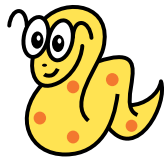

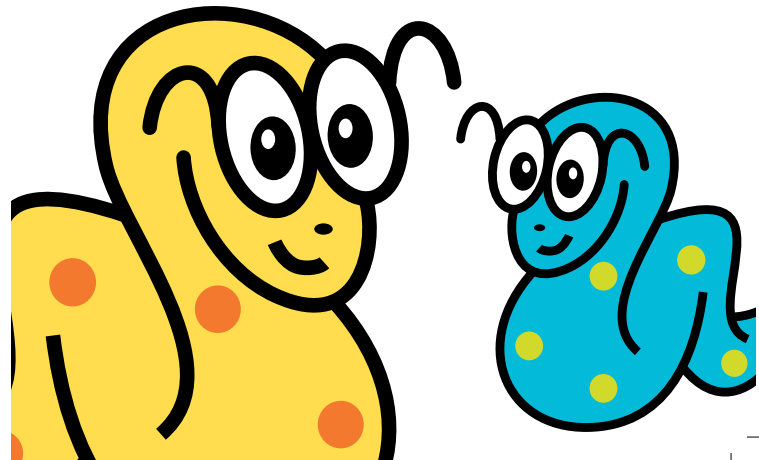

Enrichment Program

This program offers average to above-average students instruction in study/organizational strategies, comprehension improvement and vocabulary expansion.

Remedial Program

Students having difficulty with a specific reading skill are provided with prescriptive instruction. A variety of materials are used to accommodate particular learning strengths and weaknesses.

Early Reading and Preschool Parent Workshops

This program offers four and five-year-olds reinforcement in letter recognition, letter sounds, sight word mastery, vocabulary development and listening comprehension. Summer Writing Program
